

# **St. Clair River Area of Concern**

The St. Clair River Remedial Action Plan (RAP) is a multi-sector initiative consisting of government, industry, academic, the community and environmental organizations. Its goal is to clean up, enhance and sustain the ecosystem of the St. Clair River Area of Concern. The St. Clair Region Conservation Authority is seeking a self-motivated individual to fill the following position:

## **St. Clair River Canadian Remedial Action Plan Coordinator**

### **Responsibilities:**

The St. Clair River Canadian RAP Coordinator will support the St. Clair River Area of Concern structure and act as a primary contact for the Remedial Action Plan in the area. Specific responsibilities include:

- coordinate implementation activities and initiatives that make progress towards achieving environmental protection and remediation goals in support of the St. Clair RAP.
- provide support and coordination for the Canadian RAP Implementation Committee.
- limited support to the Binational Public Advisory Committee and other committees and working groups related to the St. Clair River Remedial Action Plan as determined by the supervisory team
- update work plans and related documents addressing priority actions.
- coordinate and report on the activities of the various implementation agencies within the St. Clair AOC, projects identified in the work plans or aimed at achieving delisting targets
- provide information updates to the BPAC and Friends of the St. Clair River
- support the assessment and revision of delisting criteria and the assessment of the status of Beneficial Use Impairments for the St. Clair River RAP
- provide support for St. Clair River AOC member projects that support the St. Clair River RAP (through publicity, assistance with funding applications, etc)
- act as a RAP liaison in the community with First Nations, US RAP Team, media, and other organizations (both Canadian and US) that are involved with the St. Clair River
- coordinate the development and delivery of any St. Clair River Update Reports and other St. Clair River RAP publications
- occasional evening and weekend work will be required

The duties of the position will be guided by a Supervisory Team comprised of members from Environment Canada, Ontario Ministry of the Environment, and the St. Clair Region Conservation Authority.

**Qualifications:**

- university degree in a physical, natural or applied science program
- experience in planning, organizing and administering geographically based, multi-disciplinary, multi-jurisdictional environmental programs aimed at restoring or protecting natural ecosystems.
- demonstrated skills in stakeholder consultation
- experience in reviewing scientifically based information, various remedial action techniques
- must be able to work independently and have excellent communication skills
- valid Class G drivers license
- valid passport

Based on current funding agreements, this position will currently run until March 31, 2010. It is very likely however that this position will be extended between 1 to 5 years beyond that date as new funding agreements are put into place.

This position will work from the offices of the St. Clair Region Conservation Authority.

Salary for the position is \$52,427- \$65,534 per year plus an excellent benefits package.
